Why so much time?
Because the goal is spiritual (spiritual multiplication). For that goal realized, it is a time consuming
process!!
The 21 st Century "discipleship dilemma"
- Understanding biblical discipleship forces a re of our lives and our energy.
Identifying Mark #6: Numerical
a. Effective discipleship can never take place if you are attempting to work with too many people at one time.
Jesus' plan was multiplication, and that depends upon spiritually mature, well disciples. Disciples like that are
never produced!
For discipleship to really be effective, discipleship will need to be on, and you must work with only a few
people at any given time.

An important element of a discipling relationship is being willing to the disciple when he needs reproof.

A BIBLICAL AND FUNCTIONAL DEFINITION OF DISCIPLESHIP
Discipleship is the process by which a Christian with a
life of following (Example) commits himself (Commitment)
for an extended period of time (Time) another individual (Numerical limitation)
who has been to Christ, (Component #1) the purpose being to
aid and guide (Direction) (Love, Admonition, Guardianship) their growth to maturity (Component #2)
equip them to reproduce themselves in a spiritual generation. (Component #3)
